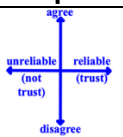

Source A strongly agrees that Bolshevik rule had a positive impact on Russians.

Source A states that the "Soviet government" was had "peaceful development" and that the Commission had to "prevent" "sabotage in Russia," the "enemies" knew that "heavy hands" would "come down" at any opposition against the Soviet Government.

This shows that source A viewed opposition against the Soviet Government and Bolsheviks would only serve to harm the Russian people since the Bolsheviks brought stability to Russia and protected the Russians.

Source A was written by a high ranking Bolshevik, leading to the source being biased to Bolsheviks.

NEUTRAL SOURCE - A

Source A isn't reliable because it is biased to Bolsheviks since it was written by one. Source C moderately disagrees that Bolshevik rule had a positive impact on Russians.

Source C states that the "People's Commissar" have been "improving the situation" by helping the "war-disabled" saying that the "most important accomplishment" was a "decree" giving "maternity and infant welfare," a decree that was signed by her.

This shows how source C views the most positive changes being made by herself and not the Bolsheviks. Alexandra's changes help support the Russian people while the Bolsheviks are the main cause of injury.
